Penalty Notice

We will be sending parent/carers a penalty notice (fine) if:

- Your child's attendance falls below 90 per cent in a term period without a good reason.
- You take your child out of school during term time (for holidays for example) without agreeing the leave with the school.

The full penalty of £120 per parent per child is imposed but is reduced to £60 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to meet the payment within 28 days could result in the matter being referred to the Magistrates court in accordance with Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

This week in Coral Class, the learners have been enjoying being fully immersed in the new theme of on the beach. The learners have painted their own beach using multi-sensory resources. This included blue paint, sand, as well as using their hands to print
