### Schools are required to:

- Inform parents that their child's attendance is a concern, offer support & challenge where appropriate.

### Where support is not taken up:

- Formal letters from school.
- Request for NPR (Notification of Parental Responsibility), SAP (School Attendance Panel), FPN (Fixed Penalty Notice).

### Fines can be requested for:

- Ten unauthorised lates in six consecutive school weeks - Under the U code.
- Ten unauthorised absences in six consecutive school weeks – Under the O code.

We have been going swimming every Tuesday, to the Feel Good centre in Walthamstow. The learners have really been enjoying these sessions and are learning new skills every time they go.



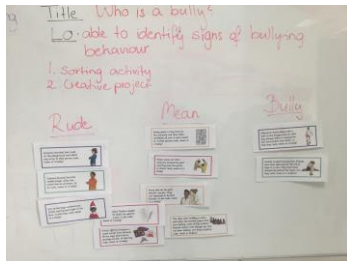
They have also been learning about the Solar System and all the planets and have created some amazing work and displays about this topic.
