

Impact of Sports Premium at Lime Academy Hornbeam 2023/24

Overview

PE and Sports Premium is used to develop and/or add to the PE and sports activities that the school already offers and to ensure that improvements made now will benefit the current cohort and those who join in future years. Schools receive this funding to support their eligible pupils and narrow the attainment gap between them and their peers. During the 2023/24 academic year Lime Academy Hornbeam will receive £16,720.

These funds are for schools to use to support pupils. Most schools with primary-age pupils, including special schools receive the PE and sport premium each academic year.

Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. In cases where schools don't follow year groups (for example, in some special schools), pupils aged 5 to 10 attract the funding. In most cases, the Government determines how many pupils in each school attract the funding using data from the January school census. Funding for 2022 to 2023 Schools with 16 or fewer eligible pupils receive £1,000 per pupil.
